

How to Navigate the Application Form

The application is divided into three main sections:

1. **About You**

This section includes multiple-choice questions and basic personal information to help us understand your background and context.

2. **About Your Project**

Here, you'll find a mix of tick-box options and two short-answer questions:

- A brief description of your project or idea (max. 150 words)
- A project title that best represents your work and helps identify your application

3. **About Your Leadership**

- This final section asks you to reflect on your leadership journey in a response of up to 500 words.
- You'll also be asked to upload your CV (maximum 2–3 pages).

Please note: Each question in the form includes a brief instruction to help you answer clearly. These individual instructions will not appear in this overview but are available directly within the application form.

Your answer should include these four key points:

1. The kind of change you want to lead in your community
2. How you would use your own project to inspire others
3. What leadership qualities or life experiences make you a strong candidate
4. Why you want to become the Fempower Leadership Ambassador in your country and what drives you

Please write in your own words. It's okay to use AI tools to help polish or refine your writing but your ideas, passion, and story should be truly your own. We want to hear *your* voice, not one generated entirely by AI.

19. **Upload CV**

Please upload your CV in **PDF or Word format**, with a **maximum length of 2–3 pages**. Kindly **do not include your gender, photo, age, or other personal data not relevant to your experience or qualifications**.

This means that applicants may be strong candidates whether they bring **academic achievements without prior hands-on experience in the field**, or **empirical and practical experience without formal academic qualifications**—such as volunteering, community leadership, or grassroots involvement—

All applications are assessed based on the **potential of the proposed idea or project**, as well as the applicant's **academic merit or demonstrated leadership through lived experience**. We recognise and value diverse pathways to impact, and are committed to a fair, inclusive evaluation process that prioritises substance, purpose, and potential over background or appearance.
